ongmont loses 'The Colonel'

Straight was retired Air Force colonel who fought to reopen Rollins Pass

LONGMONT - Den E. Straight, a retired Air Furce colonel and tireless advocate of reopening Rollins Pass

Broad over the Continental Divide to Winter Park, died suddenly Wednesday. He was \$4.

A longitime local resident, Straight volunteered with groups ranging from the American Red Cross to the Bey Scouts. He helped launch the Twin Peaks Rotary. Originally from Greeley, Straight

and his family settled in Longmont around 1976 after he retired from the Air Force, for which he had flown

more than 29 types of aircraft. The front fuselage of one of them, a B-268 Marauder nicknamed "Flack Bait," is displayed at the Smithsonian.

Straight, known locally to many as "The Calonel," was one of many pilots of the storied World War II bomber. He flew one mission in the bomber, on Valentine's Day 1945, carrying his young daughter's shoe in his pocks

Reference your letter File 7720-2-1 Dated January 25, 2007. It is quite evident that a neophyte without access cannot follow the many publications and laws that the Forest Service operates under. H.R. 1576 the James Peak Wilderness and Protection Area Act stated the Rollins Pass (Moffat Road) would be returned to two-wheeled drive capability. We do have three counties involved and each of them have expressed a desire to restore the road. Selecting the lead county seems to be the hold up. The Needles Eye Tunnel is in Boulder County.

The Forest service was directed to provide "technical assistance and otherwise cooperate with respect to repairing the Rollins Pass road." It is my interpretation that this would mean assistance in preparing documentation to comply with Forest Service directives. Your predecessor Lynn Young was available and involved throughout our efforts from 1983-1987. He represented the Forest Service, along with Josephine Heath, Boulder County Commissioner and, myself in receiving the prestigious Stephen H. Hart Award from the Colorado Historical Society. I should add that District Ranger Shelly Nolde was a big part of our "Eye Opening Ceremony" at the tunnel on July 3, 1988.

It is my understanding that county attorneys have met to discuss an inter-governmental-agreement. Now that the election is over maybe further progress can be made. As a not-for-profit organization we are ready to assist in any way we can. We have 350 annual members and 150 Lifetime members.

Our motto is NEVER GIVE UP and we do not intend to. Will you help?
